
Summer has arrived in Belgrade, and your BHS has been busy! Our summer activities began early, as BHS participated in the arts and crafts fair organized by the Belgrade Community Center and held in the Belgrade Lakes Village Green on the last Sunday in May (May 30). BHS hosted a booth with two tables. One table held a display of antique kitchen utensils, which dated back to the late 19th and early 20th centuries. All those items are from our Connie Keschl Memorial Collection, which we acquired last year. Visitors of all ages, from great-grandparents to great-grand kids found this display particularly fascinating, with the youngsters competing among themselves at guessing for what the more unusual implements—by 21st century standards—may have been used. One unusual metal item even had the older folks, including BHS volunteers, trying to guess its possible use 100 years ago! (The consensus among the 65+ experienced canners: That unusual implement probably was used in the process of canning fruits and vegetables!).

On that same table, we also featured a complementing display of cookbooks that various Belgrade community groups compiled during the past 80 years. Among them were cookbooks by the Belgrade Grange; the Belgrade Ladies Aid Society of

the Old South Church; the Union Church; and the Village Inn (featuring Mrs. Paul Povandie's recipes from the 1960s).

The BHS 2020 reprint of the 1932 Grange Cookbook, which has a colorful new cover, stood out in this display!

Our second table featured items for sale, including copies of all BHS publications, and reproductions of old photographs and post cards. This table proved to be as busy as the exhibit table. We thank everyone who stopped by our tables to



talk about history, buy items and keep us busy. The Arts and Crafts Fairs are going to continue, on the last Sunday of every month until the end of September. BHS plans to have a table with different historical items from our collections on display at each one, albeit small and portable items, but always interesting ones. Please be sure to visit us at the next fair in the Belgrade Lakes Village Green, across Main Street (Route 27) from Hello Good Pie bakery and St. Helena's Catholic Church:

Sunday, June 27, 2020, from 10:00 am to 3 pm!



BHS Books for Sale!




A reprint of The Belgrade Grange cookbook is available at Hello Good Pie and Oliver and Friends Bookstore in Belgrade Lakes Village.


